




Decreased PTSD

After 12 months, participants in the program experienced a 22.8% decrease in PTSD symptomology.



Improved self-efficacy

At 12 months, participants noted an 18.7% improvement in their ability to manage internal and external post-traumatic recovery.



Community

Survivors increased their sense of community over 12 months by 6%.



Over a span of twelve months, a clinically significant improvement was observed, resulting in a reduction to a moderate level of anxiety.



Over the course of 12 months, there was a clinically significant change with a decrease to a normal level of stress.

Loved Ones




The <u>Loved Ones</u> program is a scalable, trauma-informed, psychoeducational model designed to help loved ones and allies understand sexual violence, learn how to support survivors effectively and care for their mental health. It is a dynamic learning experience rooted in best practices in trauma care and group facilitation.

2025 Color It Blue Highlights

Color It Blue is Brave Step's awareness campaign held every April to support survivors, educate communities and spark action.

Throughout April, we shared more than 4,000 blue ribbons & reached approx. 76,790 people, sparking awareness, connection & courageous conversations across communities.

2,200+

More than 2,248 volunteer hours were generously contributed to bring Color It Blue to life, a testament to the compassion and commitment of our community.

100% felt more equipped or informed to help prevent sexual violence.






Budget Allocation 2024-2025

Every survivor deserves the chance to grow, and every community needs the knowledge and tools to stand against sexual violence. Whether you give your time, your voice, your resources or simply your willingness to listen, you become part of a powerful movement for change. Together, we can ensure hope is not the exception; it's the expectation.

Donate

Each contribution, no matter the size, drives our mission forward. \$100 provides:

- 60 minutes of life-giving individual counseling for a survivor.
- Group therapy sessions for two participants, fostering understanding and hope.
- Three trauma-informed assessments to help build a survivor's roadmap to well-being.

The following giving levels allow for meaningful expansion of our mission to more survivors, loved ones and allies:
